# Location and accessibility

Located in the heart of Europe, on the Eastern coast of the Adriatic sea.

**Accessible by road** - newly built, fast and modern roadways connecting all parts of the country (30,000 km), highways connecting to all major European routes.

**Accessible by sea** - international ferry lines, 15 permanent and 11 seasonal ports open for international traffic.

**Accessible by rail** - 3,000 km of railway, daily routes to neighbouring countries without good connections to destinations across Europe.

**Accessible by air** - Accessible by air - six international airports located throughout the country and major cities along the coast with new direct flights from Zagreb to Berlin, Stockholm and Tirana. Rijeka will be connected with Hahn (Germany) and Wroclaw (Poland) for the summer season. New York is connected with a direct flight to Dubrovnik from May to November.


📍 **The Church of the Holy Cross** in Nin is renowned as the **smallest cathedral** in the world. Its Romanesque architecture and rich history capture visitors.



📍 **Vinkovci** is recognized as one of **Europe's oldest cities**. With a history dating back over 8,000 years, it offers a deep connection to ancient civilizations.

📍 **Vrbnik** on the island of Krk boasts the **narrowest street** in the world, measuring just 40 cm wide. It offers a unique experience of medieval charm.

📍 **The Cathedral of Saint Domnius in Split**, built initially as a Roman mausoleum in the 4th century, is **the oldest** and still used today.



## Renowned for



📍 **Zlatni Rat (Golden Horn) on Brač Island** is a fine-pebble spit extending into the Adriatic Sea. Its form shifts with the tides, currents, and winds, creating a dynamic landscape. The beach is a haven for windsurfers and sunbathers alike, with crystal-clear waters and a backdrop of lush pine trees.

📍 Situated below the historic village of Lubenice on **Cres Island**, **Sveti Ivan Beach** is a secluded spot boasting clear waters and a tranquil atmosphere. Accessible via a hiking trail or by boat, it offers a pristine escape for nature lovers.

📍 Located near the village of Popovići in **Konavle Region**, **Pasjača Beach** is a hidden gem formed by the interplay of human intervention and natural processes. Accessible by descending a steep path through cliffs, visitors are rewarded with a serene sandy shore and pristine waters.

📍 Often cited among Europe's most beautiful beaches, **Punta Rata in Brela** features fine pebbles, clear waters, and the iconic Brela Stone. The surrounding pine forest provides natural shade, enhancing its appeal.



📍 Known for its white sandy shores and shallow, azure waters, **Sakarun Beach on Dugi Otok Island** offers a Caribbean-like ambience. The surrounding pine trees add to its picturesque setting, making it ideal for families and those seeking relaxation.

📍 Nestled within towering cliffs, **Stiniva Beach on Vis Island** is a secluded cove accessible via a narrow path or boat. Its intimate setting and clear turquoise waters make it a favourite among those seeking tranquillity and natural beauty.

📍 Tucked away beneath towering cliffs and accessible through a forest trail, **Nugal Beach near Makarska** is a secluded paradise known for its natural beauty. It's a favoured spot for those seeking privacy and unspoiled surroundings.

📍 A charming pebble beach in a secluded cove, **Dubovica on Hvar Island** is celebrated for its clear waters and traditional stone houses nearby. It's an excellent spot for swimming and snorkelling.

# Zagreb



The Capital of Croatia, **Zagreb**, is not just exceptional for its events and numerous museums: Did you know that Zagreb is one of the greenest capitals in Europe? With just a stroll over the Lenuci Horseshoe or on the shores of Jarun Lake, you will be amazed by the colliding city roofs, nature, and a blue sky.

Stroll through Ilica, ride the funicular to the Upper Town, have a cup of coffee on the “špica”, a popular meeting place, or escape to the green embrace of the Maksimir park.

## Must explore

Lenuci horseshoe, Zrinjevac, Zagreb botanical garden, Maksimir, and Medvednica are nature-touched places scattered across the city, making Zagreb one of the greenest capitals in Europe.

There are extraordinary museums, such as the Museum of Broken Relationships, the Museum of Lost Tales, the Museum of Cravat, the Chocolate Museum, and so many more...

## Must try

The Austro-Hungarian heritage is felt in every bite of the food in Zagreb, such as Grenadir Marš (tasty pasta with onions and cheese), Kajzeršmarn (an original dessert with caramelized pancakes), and krpice sa zeljem (pasta with cabbage). You should not miss the cheese puff pastries, the fresh cream and cheese, Medenjaci—honey, and Paprenjaci—pepper biscuits. These traditional treats will delight your taste buds.

# Central Croatia



**Central Croatia** offers a unique walk through the history of the world: you can discover Krapina Neanderthal man, the idyllic landscapes of the Lonjsko Polje Nature Park and the romantic rurality of the Hrvatsko Zagorje villages. Here, the message of love is expressed with a gingerbread heart, and wine is baptized on the feast of St. Martin. Immerse yourself in history and discover castles that have ignited the imagination of poets, artists and locals for centuries.

## Must explore

European stork village Čigoč with more than 250 species of birds and hundreds more of animals! The numerous fairies will take you through to Novi Dvori and the Lužnice castle, the imposing Veliki Tabor, the romantic Trakošćan, the proud Zrinski castle, the castle with two towers in Gornja Rijeka and numerous other castles dotted on the hills throughout this area. Zrinski and Frankopan's city Čakovec, castles for history buffs and romantic souls, Zagorje hills, Đurđevac with its camels and desert, Croatian Amazona Lonjsko polje, Krapina Neanderthal museum. Whatever you visit, enjoy the ride!

## Must try

Kotlovina (fried and stewed meat). Purica s mlincima and famous Zagorski štrukli for a dessert! From the sweet menu, try Samoborske kremište after the walking trails through the panoramic views, a rhapsody of smells and collages of colours. You can also taste the Međimurska gibanica, štrudla, different grappas (famous Croatian rakija) and some of the best wines. Also, in this part, don't miss visiting Korak – a Michelin-starred restaurant in Central Croatia.

# Slavonia



Situated on what used to be the shores of the Pannonian Sea, **Slavonia** boasts the most beautiful cathedral from Venice to Istanbul, horses as white as snow, castles of noble families, and the advanced culture of Vučedol.

## Must explore

UNESCO's Geopark Papuk, Water tower in Vukovar, Museum of Vučedol culture, Lipizzaner Stud Farms Đakovo and Lipik. The Croatian version of the Amazon forest, Kopački rit, is one of the largest natural wetlands in Europe. It is home to 300 different bird species, some of which are very rare and protected. Prandau-Normann castle awaits you in Valpovo, and a princely experience awaits you in Ilok, the easternmost town in Croatia. The Ilok fortress is just nearby, inside which are also the Odescalchi castle and the Ilok cellars, whose famous traminac was poured at the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II of England.

## Must try

Čobanac, fiš paprikaš, čvarci, kulen and kulenova seka, ajvar and don't miss famous wines as Chardonnay, Frankovka, Graševina, Traminac as well as Croatian famous grappa's.

# Lika - Karlovac



**Lika—Karlovac**—is full of Inspiring landscapes, magical forests known as noble forests, meandering rivers, and waterfalls cascading into a myriad of droplets. It is an irresistible invitation to explore this captivating part of Croatia.

## Must explore

The birthplace of one of the world's greatest inventors, Nikola Tesla, discover a mythical mountain with a house of its own, visit the world-famous UNESCO-protected Plitvice lakes, and visit ancient castles brimming with age-old wisdom—every corner promises new and exciting experiences. Plitvice Lakes National Park, a miracle woven from pearl drops, has been on the UNESCO list since 1979. When you walk through the cascades of dreams formed by 16 blue-green lakes and hear the deafening noise of the waterfalls, words become redundant, and emotions come to the fore. Rastoke, like the play of two rivers, Slunjčica and Korana, turned rapids and waterfalls into art in which people harmoniously shaped the mill settlement.

## Must try

In addition to the well-known Lika potatoes, which have a Protected Geographical Indication (PGI), you'll enjoy traditional lamb cooked under the embers in an iron bell, the slices of dried game, the Škripavac cheese or the distinctive Velebit honey. Plum and pear schnapps and berry liqueur are also highly appreciated locally, as are the fruits of the blueberry and raspberry forest.

During your stay in Lika, you should try the various local honey types. When in this region, don't miss visiting a starred gastro experience in Boškinac restaurant in Novalja.

## Istria



Step into the sun and immerse yourself in **Istria**. From the grandiose Arena, built by fairies according to legends, to gentle hills peppered with magical towns, paradise islands, and stone pearls off the Adriatic shore lulled to sleep by the sea. Every detail of the largest Croatian peninsula will amaze you. As soon as you pass the mysterious mountain of the Učka Nature Park, you will be greeted by a green and blue rhapsody, an intoxicating Mediterranean garden and a forest realm where fragrant truffles grow, and history blossoms in stone alleys, courtyards, and walkways. Have you seen Croatian Jurassic Park, dinosaur traces, zebras, or luxurious villas in National Park Brijuni?

### Must explore

National park Brijuni, medieval towns such as Motovun, Grožnjan, Završje, Oprtalj or the smallest town in the world - Hum. Višnjan for astronomy lovers, Svetvinčenat and its Morosini-Grimani Castle, as well as the cities of Pazin, Labin and many others.

### Must try

Gourmets will look forward to visiting Buzet, the town of truffles. You can even try foraging for this world-famous gastronomic delicacy in the surrounding forests.

## Kvarner



Welcome to the fragrant gates of the Adriatic - **Kvarner!** Balancing between the Adriatic Sea and Gorski Kotar, this region offers a unique blend of experiences. Spend your winters skiing on Platak with a view of the sea, and in the summers, set sail on the dreamy blue vastness of the Adriatic. Discover hidden beaches, explore the charming island towns, and embark on adrenaline-filled active holidays amidst the villas of the Kvarner Riviera. This region promises to be the canvas for countless new and memorable experiences.

### Must explore

The nearly 100 kilometres of indented coastline in Kvarner encompass three rivieras: the Opatija Riviera, the Crikvenica – Novi Vinodol Riviera, and the Rijeka Riviera. Whether you seek the warm autumn colours, the idyllic white landscapes of winter, or the refreshing summer greens, numerous walking and cycling paths await to guide you to crown jewels like Kamačnik, Zeleni Vir, Vražji Prolaz, and the Lokvarka Cave. Risnjak National Park, Butterfly Valley, a haven for almost 500 different species of these beautiful, fragile creatures. Učka Nature Park, Grobnik Alps, and the cliffs of Bijele and Samarske Stijene are among those rare places in the world where you can still experience truly untouched nature. Attractive cycling routes through beautiful landscapes and places on the islands of Krk, Cres, Rab and Lošinj.

### Must try

Start with an aperitif of mistletoe, rue or honey schnapps, enjoy your meal and make room for a sweet dessert ending with kroštule, krafī or fritule fried dough pastries. And for Michelin starred restaurants, visit Alfred Keller on island Mali Lošinj or Nebo by Deni Srdoč in beautiful Rijeka.



## Zadar



**Zadar** hinterland is a treasure trove of untouched nature, containing mountains, waterfalls, magnificent forests, and mysterious caves. In the southern part of the Velebit Nature Park, you will find the breathtaking rocks of the Paklenica National Park. If you wish to enjoy more relaxed activities, the Vrana Lake Nature Park is the ideal destination for you. Where Vrana Lake ends, a riviera full of magical beaches begins. The Zadar region is also known for its many islands with unique stories.

**Must explore**

If you are visiting island Pag, do not miss to enjoy the beauty of the Pag lace, which made the UNESCO list of intangible heritage, as well as delicious bites of the unique Pag cheese. You must explore the island Olib - the Adriatic king of sandy beaches. On Dugi otok, you will find the magical Telašćica Nature Park with over 160-meter-high cliffs that inspire awe. Enjoy the sun in Zaton holiday Resort and explore the Queens beach Nin or the smallest cathedral in the world. The magnificent views of Paklenica, overlooking canyons, caves, karstic holes and the blue expanse of the open sea laced by a string of lovely islands. Have a look on Galešnjak – Croatian island of love.

**Must try**

With a slice of Pag cheese and a glass of the famous Maraschino, a local liqueur made from the native Maraska sour cherry, in your hand, you can enjoy all the blessings of this area and the fruits of this land of matchless, divine inspiration. Brudet, brujet, brodet or, if you will, brodetto, is the most common dish on the Croatian Adriatic, but it is especially loved throughout Dalmatia. The magic of a good brudet is that it makes the types of fish normally regarded as nothing special reveal their hidden, unexpected qualities when combined with others in a finely balanced blend.

## Šibenik



Embraced by the Adriatic Sea and the mighty Dina-  
ra Mountains, **Šibenik** will delight you with its national parks, magnificent rivers and spectacular locations. Welcome to the land of grandiose fortresses, pearly waterfalls and the flying man Faust Vrančić. The Šibenik region turns you into the hero of an adventure novel that will reveal the highest Croatian mountain peaks, the smallest islands in the Adriatic and stone buildings whose genes are written with a rich history.

**Must explore**

The famous Irish writer and Nobel Prize winner George Bernard Shaw dedicated magical verses for Kornati islands saying that: “On the last day of creation, God desired to crown His work, and thus created the Kornati islands out of tears, stars, and breath.” The waterfalls of the river Krka and the Franciscan monastery on the tiny island of Visovac, set in the middle of the lake widening in the river like a precious stone.

The secluded offshore Žirje, rich in fish, is the perfect place for modern Robinsons, the island of Kaprije named after the Mediterranean caper plant whose buds are used as a spice, the most prominent coral divers in the Adriatic come from the island of Zlarin, smallest and most scarcely populated Adriatic island of Krapanj boasts masters of sponge harvesting and diving.

Following the indented coastline of the Šibenik region, you will witness many beautiful beaches and tourist spots such as Rogoznica, Primošten, or Vodice, and once you spot the St. Anthony Channel and the powerful outline of the St. Nicholas' Fort under the protection of UNESCO on the horizon, you will know that you are approaching one of the most beautiful Dalmatian towns.

**Must try**

Cheese ripened in a lamb skin sack and the Drniš prosciutto, washed down with a glass of Babić red wine from Primošten are just the beginning of a festival of flavours in Šibenik. Sardines, fresh tuna, a delicious pastry filled with a mixture of olives, figs and olive oil, or the desserts made with dry figs, jujube and almonds will delight your senses. Wild oysters which can be taken out of the sea and slurped on the dock, simply and precisely prepared grilled fish, the unique Skradin risotto. Michelin also gave a star to the restaurant Pelegrini in Šibenik, which can awaken your tastes on another level.

# Split



The centre of Dalmatia, or as its residents would call it, the “centre of the whole world”, is **Split**, the largest city in the Croatian part of the Adriatic coast. The old city centre, which is under the protection of UNESCO, is over 1700 years old and it was created when the Roman Emperor Diocletian decided to build his palace there.

## Must explore

The magnificent Diocletian’s Cellars, a filming location for Game of Thrones. Golden Gate, which was once used only by the emperor and his family. Cathedral of St. Domnius, the patron saint of Split, located in the former imperial mausoleum, which is one of the world’s oldest Christian buildings. Sail through Vis archipelago and be mesmerised by the natural beauty Omiš as a pirate stronghold city.

Climbing the forts of Fortica and Mirabela, try the zipline above the Cetina canyon and test your limits by paragliding. The most beautiful beaches in Croatia are Zlatni Rat on the Island of Brač, Stiniva Beach on the Island of Vis, or any beach on the Makarska Riviera.

Biokovo—Imotski lakes can be a one-of-a-kind experience you will remember forever. While there, don’t miss the Biokovo skywalk.

## Must try

Here, one can feast on local specialties, from sea delicacies to lamb and the ‘arambašići’ of Sinj, washed down with the finest red wines.

# Dubrovnik



**Dubrovnik** - from historic walls to wineries, from warm seas to a star-studded sky, southern Croatia offers adventures of all types. The land of the Greek hero Odysseus, famous explorer Marco Polo, and a rich culture invites you to explore its incredible landscapes, fascinating legends, and stunning beauty.

## Must explore

1,940 meters of medieval walls outline people’s dreams of freedom, and a performance stage leads to the stars during the Dubrovnik Summer Festival or to the Iron Throne in Game of Thrones.

Visit museums to explore historical and natural sights, discover the green realm of the Trsteno Arboretum, and enjoy the panorama from the Srđ hill, which can be easily reached by cable car. The Romans called Lastovo the imperial island, while the neighbouring Mljet is known as Odysseus’ Island. Moreška, a unique romantic battle dance with sabres, which generations of island families proudly participate in, has flowed in from the waterfalls of Korčula’s history.

The islets of Badija, Vrnik, or Proizd are perfect summer oases for those who wish to enjoy the sea in peace.

## Must try

Savour the oysters and mussels of Ston, the finest shellfish in the Adriatic, the eel and frog stew from the Neretva valley with some of the best wines from the south, such as Dingač and Postup from Pelješac and Pošip and Grk from Korčula, not to mention Dubrovnik’s malvasia from Konavle. And if you are looking for something sweet, indulge yourself with pastries like Rožata, Kotonjata or Mantala cakes.





## MUSEUMS AND GALERIES:

### Croatian Natural History Museum, Zagreb

**HIGHLIGHTS:** After a comprehensive three-year renovation costing €31.6 million, the museum in Zagreb's Upper Town now features state-of-the-art exhibitions, interactive displays, and enhanced facilities.

### Cravaticum – The Museum of the Cravat, Zagreb

**HIGHLIGHTS:** Situated in the city centre's Tomićeva street, this unique museum delves into the history of the cravat, an accessory that originated in Croatia. The museum offers an artistic approach to its exhibits, featuring interactive displays and a small cinema hall.

### Moneterra – Money Museum, Zagreb

**HIGHLIGHTS:** Established by the Croatian National Bank, Moneterra provides insights into the history of money, banking, and the roles of central banks. It's designed to enhance financial literacy through engaging and modern exhibits.

### The Museum of Lost Tales – House of Wonders from Croatian Folktales, Zagreb



**New Trieste-Rijeka Train Route:** A scenic international train journey between Trieste (Italy) and Rijeka (Croatia) has been reinstated, offering a unique hop-on, hop-off experience through Slovenia.

**Enhanced Ferry Connectivity Between Croatia and Montenegro:** A fast ferry now operates between Budva (Montenegro) and Dubrovnik, offering a scenic 90-minute catamaran ride.


